

Modern Slavery Statement

Purpose

This statement is made pursuant to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It constitutes HW Coates' slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2020.

Structure and supply chains

HW Coates is the UK's number 1 chemical warehousing and transport company. Through our network of upper and lower tier COMAH sites we serve most of the major names in global chemicals.

We have approximately 300 employees, all of whom are based in the United Kingdom and are largely directly employed. The Company is not in favour of slavery and we are resolved not to use slaves and will not use suppliers that do.

HW Coates is committed to improve its practices to identify and eliminate any slavery and human trafficking in its business and supply chains by having an ongoing and open dialogue with its suppliers and contractors.

Supporting Policies

HW Coates has the following policies in place which aim to minimise the risk of modern slavery in our supply chain and reflect our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in how we go about our business:

- Corporate Responsibility Policy

Due Diligence

The Company has a zero-tolerance approach to slavery and human trafficking and expects the same from our suppliers and contractors. HW Coates will not conduct business knowingly with any company or person who is engaged in modern slavery practices or knowingly permits them to be carried out as part of its business.

Suppliers or contractors which may pose a risk will be monitored and may be audited if required and all staff are encouraged to report any suspected instances of the use of slaves to management.

Measuring Effectiveness

For 2019 we have had no recorded instances of the use of slaves in our business or our suppliers. Our target for zero such instances has been met.

Training for Staff

Training and resources are provided to management and employees who are responsible for our supply chains and recruitment to assist them in identifying and preventing modern slavery and human trafficking. This includes a Modern Slavery Act Guidance document.
